



SERVIETTE RING



This project is to make a serviette ring that is about 45mm long and 40mm inside diameter. You can use plain wood, plain wood and decoration, or figured wood.




Start with a piece of wood 60mm long, and the grain running along this axis, and 50mm square. If you want to have a fatter serviette ring, or plan to lavishly carve the surface, start with a wider piece of wood. Mount this in a chuck, make it round and cut a perfect face on the outer end.




Cut with a chisel, or drill, the centre out to a depth slightly beyond the length of the planned ring. The sides of this should be straight. Sand and finish this inside area.



Turn the outside to shape and slightly beyond the planned length of the ring. Sand and finish this area.



Use a skew chisel to carefully cut the ring away from the scrap end in the chuck. Hand sand and finish this cut end.



To personalise it, on one side carve the initial of the person you have made it for.
