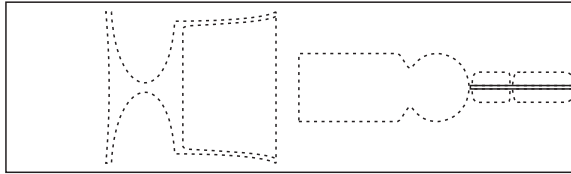
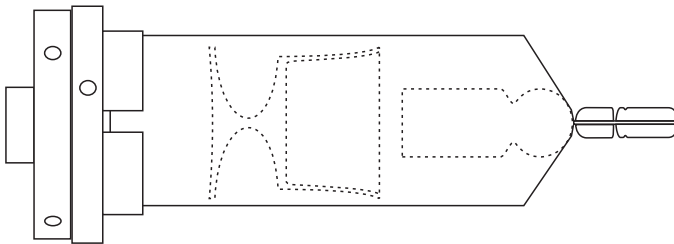


A Doll on a Chair

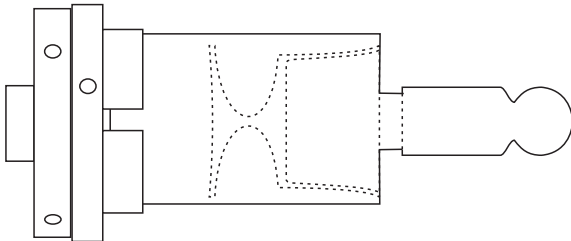
This may be part of a child's dolls house or, as first seen by me, a Christmas Tree decoration. This plan is drawn to start with a piece of wood 45mm square and 150mm long.



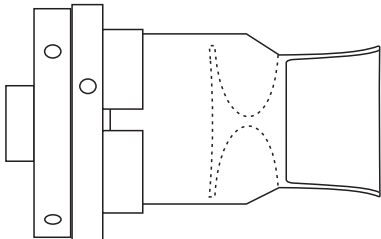
Before mounting the wood on the lathe make a fine saw cut on the centre line at the tailstock end extending 27mm down the wood.



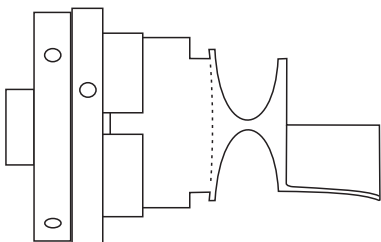
Mount the wood in a chuck. Turn it round. Cut down to 8mm diameter at the tailstock end. The longer pieces are the doll's arm - note the notch that is the wrist. The shorter pieces are shoes. Sand before parting off using the tip of a skew chisel. Set these pieces aside.



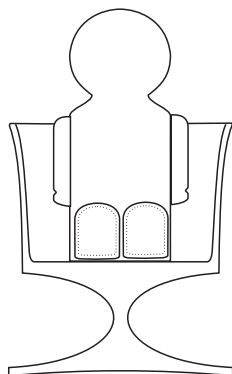
Cut the body and head of the doll to shape. Start the parting-off cut. Sand this part. Complete the parting-off cut. Set this part aside



Cut the outside of the upper part of the chair to shape and hollow the inside. Sand inside and out. With a fine saw cut down the centre line to the seat of the chair then in from one side to meet the cut down. Sand these sawn surfaces.



Cut below the seat of the chair to make a thin stem. Start the parting cut below the base of the chair. Sand all surfaces. Complete the parting off and hand sand the bottom of the chair.



Assemble the doll into the chair. Draw on eyes, add hair and maybe a bow at the throat.
