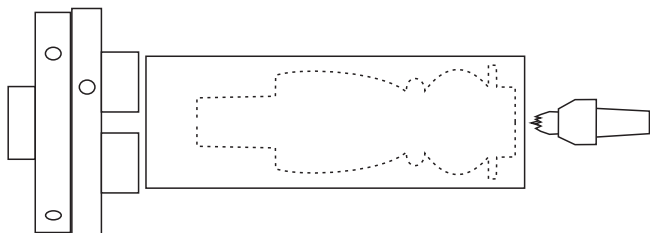


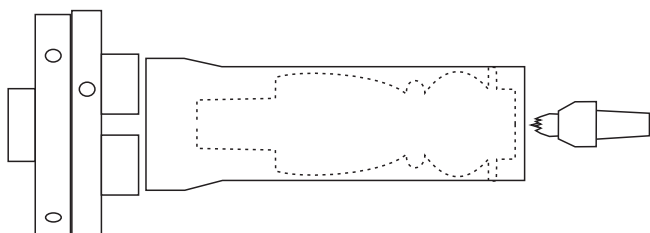
A Peg Doll

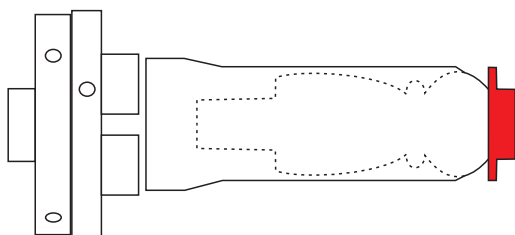
This little project provides a multitude of opportunities for painting and decorating a wooden doll. Start with wood that is 35mm square and about 100 long. Have your painting materials ready for use.



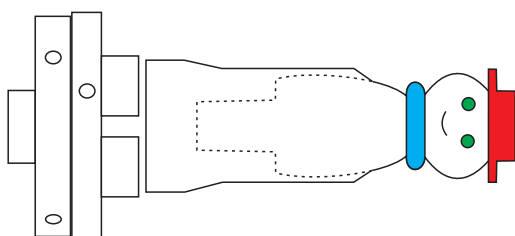
Mount the wood in a chuck and bring up the tailstock for added security.



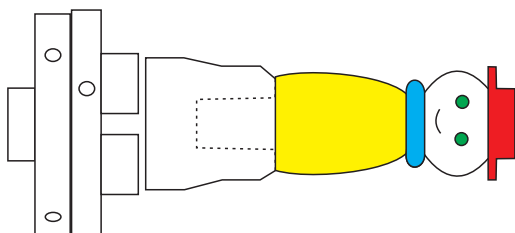
Make the wood round and down to the diameter of the widest part of the doll.



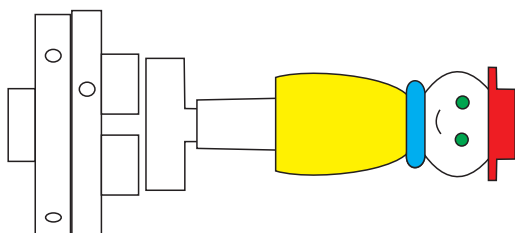
Remove the tailstock. Turn the head to the shape of your choice. Sand this area. You may apply colour to this area now.



Turn the head and collar. Sand this area. The collar may be made as a captive ring and can be painted now. The head may be best left unpainted or with hair painted on. Eyes can be added at this time.



Turn the body. Sand and colour this area.



Turn the legs and sand this area. Then part the doll off, with a straight or concave cut, from the remaining wood.
